Report from North Lincolnshire Ward Councillor Min 34/2015

Cllr Oldfield : Environment Agency carrying out flood defence work in Station Road Burringham will be closing the road at some point, will be open after 7pm & at weekends, children attending the school from Burringham will be catered for. No communications between the EA & himself where & when this will happen. No extra flood protection had been carried out near the school concerned that if the Trent over topped again the school could be damaged. Parking by parents etc in the school safety zone could not be ticketed as the notices are advisory only, looking at possibility of introducing a TRO. NLC Highways had completed the survey re the vibrations on the A18 Doncaster Road causing structural damage to properties on Hilton Ave/Fillingham Crescent which had proved far to low to cause damage to these properties. Still looking into reducing the speed limit in this area to 30mph. Cllr Devine stated there were several different surface levels, Cllr Gosling that the road was not dug out but just top dressed. Objecting to Police helicopter being moved from it's base at Humberside Airport to Wakefield due to Government cuts in police spending, this affects everybody as the time to arrive at incidents in this area could be 25 minutes. Burringham by pass set to be a reality following petitions by himself & Andrew Percy M.P. had been included in the ruling group & the opposition budgets for next year. Council tax would remain same last year ; Humberside Police increased by 2%. No report on NAT meeting

**Playing Field Matters cont...**

Cllr Oldfield had obtained quote from Rigby Wireworks, Sheffield for further set of double gates to be erected to the field via Station Road/Edwards Road total for supply & fit £1125.00 plus VAT. In his opinion required as safety point for ambulance access direct from Station Road should the present car park access be blocked by parked vehicles. Cllr Craddock asked if the present single gate would remain as the proposed new gate would be locked. Cllr Oldfield confirmed would remain. Clerk asked why we are using a company from Sheffield, we should support local business, more than one quote should be obtained. Cllr Oldfield : Standing Orders state that items under £10,000 could be approved. Cllr Devine : Further entrance would be required for new building. On a vote being taken Four in favour three against ;

**Resolved** : That the quote from Rigby Wireworks be accepted. Gates to be ordered.

**Information from Village Hall Committee Min 38/2015**

The Health & Safety Plan a condition on the Full Planning Permission, from February meeting ;  
Not yet available. (Min 19/2015 refers)

Permission to access field & storage of materials from Station Road/Edwards Road.

Cllr Craddock handed the Chairman copy of Planning Permission ; There was a condition on the Full Planning Permission that the field should not be used for access, storage of vehicles, equipment or materials in carrying out the development, this was to protect the field from damage & loss of use. Cllr Oldfield stated that the VHC had worked hard to discharge all the conditions placed on the FPP & asked if he could look at the document, this would be looked into. He stated when the MUGA was being constructed the contractor had used the car park but this would not be suitable as bricks and other materials needed to be stored securely. Ongoing.

Cllr Craddock ; in the light of this information the double gates would not be required, Cllr Porter supported this, the Parish Council would be paying for work which the VHC should be responsible for as their building would prevent vehicular access from the car park. Cllr Gosling advised that the gates had already been approved, to overturn this decision a Rescission Notice could be presented to the April meeting. Cllr D.McIlvaney : Do need another exit for other sports being played on the field, car park entrance was blocked when injury occurred at football match ambulance could not get onto field. Clerk advised that the double gates should be accessible at all times match officials should police.

**Matters Relating to Lodge Moors Estate Min 39/2015**

Quote received from "Widdy's" to erect seats & bin £300 which included all materials. Accept Verbal request for agenda item from Cllr Devine to purchase 10 trees at a cost of £175 for replacing trees knocked down by a vehicle on the exit from SUFC at the rear of the estate, LMRA would plant. Further 2 dog bins on PROW adjacent to new shopping park, Cllr Oldfield informed meeting that Mr Sanderson PROW Officer NLC had agreed to supply one bin. Clerk advised that PROW's are the responsibility of NLC it is their land, if Parish Council purchased it would be our responsibility to finance the servicing etc. Cllr's Devine & P.McIlvaney stated that they would empty the extra bins, Clerk advised this would be a Health & Safety issue.

**Resolved** : To fund the trees for £175. Further information required on bins.

Cllr P.McIlvaney complained at the length of time it was taking to erect the seats & bin which had been delivered in January, Clerk informed Members that permission had had to be sought for siting from NLC which had caused the delay. (Min 25/2015 refers).
